Students do a gallery walk of the models and provide constructive feedback on the models of their peers.

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Identifying Landforms and Bodies of Water on a Map ...

Draw lines coming out of the large circle and draw three medium circles at the ends of the lines. Leave plenty of space for additional circles. Collect various pictures of bodies of water: ocean, lake, river, stream, pond, waterfall, pool, reservoir, etc. Books, travel magazines, and the internet are good sources.
