If you are referencing a journal article which you have read online (on a website or as a PDF), you do not need to include [online], the URL or the access date in your reference. This is different from all other online items. One author. Family name, INITIAL(S). Year. Title of article. Journal Title. Volume(issue number), page numbers. Example:

In-Text Citations for a Journal Article in Harvard Referencing. To cite a journal article, you need to provide the author's surname and the year of publication (separated by a comma) in parentheses: The yellow plumage indicates a blue tit's diet (Couzens, 2010). If you name the author(s) in the text, only the year of publication is required:

They are located in the body of the work and contain a fragment of the full citation. Depending on the source type, some Harvard Reference in-text citations may look something like this: "After that I lived like a young rajah in all the capitals of Europe...". (Fitzgerald, 2004).

The rules for referencing both single and multiple authors apply to all sources, whether the material came from books, magazine articles, newspaper articles, journal articles, or online sources. Include the last name and first initials of each author, with each individual separated by a comma.

The following format should be used when referencing electronic journal articles: Surname, Initials. (Year) Title of article. Title of journal, Vol no (issue no), pp. page nos [Online]. Available from: website address. [Accessed date viewed]. The [accessed date] is included as often links to Web-based resources can change.

Tips: In the title of the journal article capitalise only the first word and proper nouns. In the journal title capitalise all major words.; Sometimes an issue will be referred to by a season or month, rather than by a number. If this happens, use the season or month as the issue number in your reference list, without the 'no.' (as in the second example above).

Harvard Referencing Examples. Journal Article To be made up of: Author (surname followed by initials). Year of publication (in round brackets). Title of article (in single quotation marks). Title of journal (in italics - capitalise first letter of each word in title, except for linking words such as and, of, the, for). ...

Journal article with DOI. DOIs ((digital object identifiers) are not essential in Harvard referencing style if you have the full bibliographic details for a journal article (i.e. volume/issue/page numbers). However, you must provide the DOI if your lecturer specifically requires you to do so, or if you are citing an article which is published online only without volume/issue/page numbers.
