Wherever the need for manual handling of loads by workers cannot be avoided, the employer shall organize workstations in such a way as to make such handling as safe and healthy as possible and assess, in advance if possible, the health and safety conditions of the type of work involved, and in particular examine the characteristics of loads, taking account of Annex I as well as to take care to avoid or reduce the risk particularly of back injury to workers, by taking appropriate measures ...

Manual Handling Manual handling includes movements (lifting, pushing, pulling, holding, throwing, carrying) and repetitive tasks (packing, typing, assembling, cleaning, sorting, using tools and machinery). Unsafe manual handling can lead to sprains and strains, soft tissue injuries, back problems, hernias and chronic pain.

Manual Handling - Occupational Health & Safety

Manual handling is defined by current regulations as the transport or support of a load by hand or bodily force. This includes lifting, putting down, pushing, pulling, carrying, manoeuvring or transporting. Employers or employees that seriously breach manual handling regulations potentially face large fines and/or a custodial sentence.

You should first design the manual handling operations to be as safe as reasonably practicable. You should also monitor and review procedures to make sure workers understand and apply them....

Manual handling at work: Training - HSE

The definition of manual handling in Regulation 68 refers to activities where the characteristics of the load pose a risk and the ergonomic conditions of the activity are unfavourable. Regulation 69(c) requires that a risk assessment be carried out on all work tasks which involve manual handling activity.
